Our Business courses are tailored to meet your needs, whether you're seeking to start a new career, advance in your current role, or broaden your expertise. Taught by professionals and with a focus on practical, real-world applications, you will be equipped

with the knowledge, skills, and confidence required to succeed in today's ever-evolving workplace.

Creative Industries

Creativity and making is at the heart of what we do here and our strong links with industry ensure you will be well prepared for a successful career. Our creative degrees are based in our historic, purpose-built creative setting in Taunton, which houses industry-standard facilities, offering students the chance to use a blend of traditional and contemporary processes to create their work.

Workshop spaces include airy art studios with life drawing rooms, plenty of scope for collaborative work and specialist workshops for ceramics, casting, woodwork, metalwork and photography.

There are three purpose-built media make-up studios. These include two professional-standard studio spaces with mirrored stations in each, and a workshop-based room with workbenches and ceiling extraction.

We have a fume room where students can use processes such as fibre glass moulding and EasyFlo, as well as a specialist foam latex booth.

Our fashion manufacture room houses industrial sewing machines, overlockers, leather machines and cover seamers.

Large pattern and cutting tables are available as well as plenty of mannequins.

In the fabric print room, students can design and experiment with fabric and techniques such as flocking, foiling, devoré and sublimation printing. There are also vacuum print tables and dyeing facilities.

A 3D room supporting laser cutting, 3D printing and digital embroidery gives students a variety of processes and techniques to mix and get creative with.

We also have a traditional print room for printing processes such as lino/ block printing, drypoint etching, monoprinting and collograph printing.

Our vibrant creative building is also home to a live production switcher for broadcast, professional and AV users. Our Blackmagic ATEM Television Studio is designed for both broadcasters and AV professionals. The studio is perfect for live production, episodic television, web shows, AV or even live coverage of video gaming competitions.

Music students are catered for in our custom-built music production and mastering studios and recording facilities with high-end soundproof booth.

Students have access to Apple Mac and PC computer suites with a full range of creative software packages and there is a common space and public gallery for student exhibitions.





Access to HE

An Access to Higher Education Diploma is designed to provide a route for learners aged 19 or over who possess few or no formal qualifications to progress to university-level study. It can lead to a wide range of career and Higher Education opportunities.

We currently offer three different routes, each with progression opportunities linked to them:

Whilst there are no specific academic entry requirements, candidates will need a sound grasp of basic skills in English and maths. Given the course is an intensive and demanding one-year programme, students will require determination and resilience, and evidence of this will be asked for at interview.

You are required to be aged 19 or over and may be eligible for a loan to cover your course fees.




If you complete an Access to HE course and then go on and complete a degree or other recognised higher education course, you will not have to repay the remaining loan for the Access to HE course.

Higher & Degree Apprenticeships

Our expertise and partnerships with over 1,500 local, regional and national employers enable us to provide a diverse range of Apprenticeships that help address the increasing demand for higherlevel skills in Somerset and beyond.

An Apprenticeship is an effective way to study, as it enables individuals to gain a nationally recognised qualification while obtaining practical on-the-job experience.

Higher and Degree Apprenticeships have become a popular choice for individuals looking for a fast track into a career, as they provide the chance to gain applicable skills and knowledge about an industry. Higher Apprenticeships may include the achievement of academic/vocational qualifications at Level 4 and 5 such as HNCs, HNDs, and Foundation

Degrees, while Degree Apprenticeships can provide qualifications up to Level 6 or 7, such as a full BA, BSc, or BEng Honours Degree, or in some cases, even a Master's Degree.

We work closely with our network of over 1.500 employers to offer Apprenticeships in a wide range of subjects, including nursing, nuclear engineering, leadership and management, data analysis, and much more. The HNC/HND in Business
Management provides a
wide-ranging study of the business
sector and is designed for students
who wish to pursue or advance
their career in business. In addition
to the knowledge, understanding
and skills that underpin the study of
the business sector it will prepare
you for further study or training.

The Level 4 Higher National Certificate in Business Management offers a broad introduction to the subject area. You will gain a wide range of sector knowledge tied to practical skills gained in research, self-study, directed study and workplace scenarios.

I chose UCS as it seemed much more financially viable than moving away and paying accommodation costs, when I could stay at home and gain the same qualification. Studying somewhere close to home also means I can immediately focus on my work instead of adapting to life away.

Adam, Business Management HND At Level 4, students develop a broad knowledge and awareness of key aspects of the business sector through six core units, which include one unit assessed by a Pearson-set assignment.

Level 4 units may include:

- Business and the Business Environment
- Marketing Essentials
- Human Resource Management
- Management and Operations
- Management Accounting
- Managing a Successful Business Project (Pearson-set unit).

Progressing on to the Level 5 HND in year two will ensure you develop a sound understanding of the principles in the study of Management and you will learn how to apply those principles more widely. You will evaluate the appropriateness of different approaches to solving problems. On successful completion you should be able to perform effectively in your chosen field and will have the qualities necessary for employment in situations requiring the exercise of personal responsibility and decision making.

As part of this apprenticeship standard you will study a CMI Level 5 Diploma in Management & Leadership which will cover the majority of the knowledge and skills elements required. This may include the following units:

- Using reflective practice to inform personal and professional development
- Principles of management and leadership in an organisational context
- Developing, managing and leading individuals and teams to success
- Creating and delivering operation plans.

Teaching and Assessment

On-programme assessment will include regular assessment (involving your employer and University Centre Somerset), development of a portfolio demonstrating learning and development activities within the workplace and evidence of 360-degree feedback within the ongoing development portfolio.

At the point of 'gateway readiness' you will be prepared for end-point assessment which will include a

test of knowledge using scenarios, competency-based interview, assessment of portfolio evidence, a presentation of work-based project approach and findings with Q&A.

Progression Opportunities

On completion, apprentices can register as full members with the Chartered Management Institute and/or the Institute of Leadership & Management, and those with three years' management experience can apply for Chartered Manager status through the CMI.

By encouraging you to adopt an experimental approach to your learning, we help you to develop your individual skills and determine your future direction as an artist or designer. This is a gradual process, over three terms, during which you will have a chance to specialise in areas such as Creative Fashion and Textiles. Fine Art, Creative Digital Graphic Design, Photography and Media Make-up.

During your course, there may be opportunities for residential trips in the UK and abroad as well as a variety of day trips. Previous cohorts have taken opportunities to embark on study visits to London, New York, Los Angeles, Berlin and Paris among others.

Teaching and Assessment

Our specialist lecturers work closely with you throughout the year. The course is studio-based and involves continuous assessment and external moderation. Your progress is monitored by tutorials and group critiques.

BA (Hons) Subject to validation



This exciting new degree offers the opportunity to develop your creative practice into a viable business proposition within a unique and innovative professional development framework for artists, designers and entrepreneurs.

You will start the first year by establishing a strong creative identity in conjunction with expert mentors: from market analysis to 'brand' development and presentation of your ideas to the industry, you will examine the context of your practice and map your own skills gaps. There will be opportunities to work collaboratively across a range of creative disciplines to enhance your concept and establish a clear business plan.



During the second year you will start to work within a professional team using industry-standard equipment and software to shape the direction of your intended creative outcome. There will be live client briefs, competitions and may also be international enrichment activities in conjunction with our wide partnership network. You will start to test market your ideas in appropriate environments such as business showcase events, trade shows, consumer selling platforms and exhibitions.

The final year will be centred around your professional practice and the full business launch, so you establish a place in the market which may already be generating an income by the time you graduate. You will have access to excellent facilities: digital suite, creative studios, specialist workshops, collaboration spaces and an on-site enterprise hub with industry support.

Students will undertake up to six modules per year. Modules may include:

- Interdisciplinary Practice

Teaching and Assessment

As part of your course, you will be required to make external presentations and to undertake work experience.

Mature applicants with relevant experience who do not have the stated entry requirements are encouraged to apply. The type of learner who would undertake these qualifications will typically have come through a creative course at Level 3. Creative Practitioner

Foundation Degree Coming soon



This degree enables you to take a passion and turn it into a career you will enjoy. If you have a creative practice that you would like to earn a living from, this course will help you to develop the extensive skills you need to finesse your idea and establish a business plan.

You will start the first year by establishing a strong creative identity in conjunction with expert mentors: from market analysis to 'brand' development and presentation of your ideas to the industry, you will examine the context of your practice and map your own skills gaps. There will be opportunities to work collaboratively across a range of creative disciplines to enhance your concept and establish a clear business plan.

During the second year you will start to work within a professional team using industry-standard equipment and software to shape the direction of your intended creative outcome. There will be live client briefs, competitions and there may also be international enrichment activities for your participation in conjunction with our wide partnership network. You will start to test market your ideas in appropriate environments such as business showcase events, trade shows, consumer selling platforms and exhibitions.

Teaching and Assessment

Our specialist team of lecturers will guide you through a modular programme, supporting your skill development and honing your business idea. You will attend lectures on

campus and online, tutorials, practical workshops, and industry-based specialist presentations. Assessment is based on 100% coursework: both written and practical. You will complete research journals, design presentations and collaborative projects. As part of your course, you will be required to make external presentations and to undertake work experience.

Progression Opportunities

This course has been designed to equip students with the necessary skills and knowledge to launch a business at the end of the second year.

On successful completion of this course students may wish to apply to the BA (Hons) Creative Practitioner Top-up year, which UCS plans to deliver from 2027 (subject to validation).

Makeup Artistry, Prosthetic FX and Wig Making

BA (Hons)





This course is for students wishing

to pursue a career in the media

makeup industry and related
fields. A broad range of areas
are taught and the course allows
you to specialise in a technique
to enhance and stretch your
skills if you should choose to.

Over the first year you will study a
broad range of skill sets in a variety
of modules. These are developed
and diversified within the second year
of the course allowing for individual
specialisms to be developed. In the
final year there are no set pathways
within the degree, which allows for
flexibility to enable you to develop
independence within specialisms.

The qualification has been designed in collaboration with industry, ensuring that you will develop the necessary skills and knowledge for employment.

You will have access to excellent resources and facilities with state-of-the-art makeup studios and workshops.

Residential trips may be available; previous trips have been to New York, Los Angeles, Warner Bros, Harry Potter studios, London West End theatre productions and backstage tours such as Les Misérables, Aladdin, Wicked and more.

In addition to our End of Year Degree Show, selected students may have the opportunity to showcase their work at industry events such as IMATS and The Prosthetics Event.

Teaching and Assessment

Modules are taught with a mixture of in-class lectures, practical sessions,

tutorials, industry-based master classes, presentations and workshop skills. Assessment includes practical assessments, written coursework, presentations and creative portfolios.

As part of your course you will be required to undertake some work experience. This falls within the Professional Practice module in the first year of the course.

Other opportunities that arise are encouraged throughout the course.

Progression Opportunities

On successful completion of this course you will be equipped with a high level of subject practical skills and a portfolio of work. Students often take up employment opportunities within theatre, television and film productions, as well as working with makeup agencies in fashion and editorial. Others have gone on to work within the medical sector, making training appliances, prosthetic limbs and medical wigs.

Previous students have gained employment in places such as English National Opera, Madame Tussauds, Allure Magazine, London Fashion Week and on productions such as Star Wars, Game of Thrones, His Dark Materials and Doctor Who, in addition to self-employment. Students can progress on to postgraduate studies.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Typically entrants will possess:

- A minimum of 80 UCAS points from a relevant Level 3 qualification (Media Make-up, Art and Design or similar)
- At least four GCSEs including English, and preferably maths and art, at grade 4 and above, or recognised equivalent.

Mature applicants with relevant experience who do not have the stated entry requirements are encouraged to apply.

You will be asked to bring a creative portfolio to interview.



Using advanced techniques and processes you will have the opportunity to develop your own professional identity and dynamic portfolio, underpinned by an appreciation of media make-up culture and theory Students have the opportunity to specialise in a particular makeup discipline and develop their skills in that area. As a result, successful students should expect to graduate from the course with a strong portfolio in their chosen field.

Rail


